Autumn Term: Foundation Subjects

Computing

During our first half term our topic was 'We are Presenters'. This unit gave children a chance to make a short narrated video and to use this to help improve their performance. They have also learnt how to edit their videos using iMovie software. After half term, our topic was 'We are Programmers'. In this unit, the children created an animated cartoon using characters they designed. After



using a paint tool to create characters and backgrounds, they created an animation by translating a storyboard into a series of scripted instructions using 'Scratch' software.



Religious Education

Children were learning about the ways in which Christians, Hindus and Muslims describe God and what God means to different people. This involved various group tasks discussing how beliefs about God affect our lives on a daily basis and how God is perceived in different religions.
