As you may be aware - it was <u>Young Carers Action Day</u> on the 16th March 21'. We planned a lot of activities throughout March to mark the day, and we know many of you also got involved by delivering assemblies, groups, activities and different ways to mark the day. The main theme for the day was to <u>Protect Young Carers Futures</u>.

We strive to pave ways for young carers to achieve their full potential without their caring role becoming a barrier. The main aspect of our service that many young carers enjoy is respite, and access to activities - so we used this opportunity to discuss with our young carers their thoughts and feelings on protecting their future in a mindful diamond painting session, and even some dance breaks with a virtual musical statues game!

This is what young carers had to say about the skills they have learnt through their caring role:

- strong communication, maturity, patience, to be caring, better reflexes
- self-care; getting ready for the day as well as helping carer to get ready
- support each other, make new friends at the young carers service
- cooking skills, first aid skills, and being aware of safety when caring for a loved one

They also shared their hopes for the future and the types of careers they would like to have by implementing and utilising the skills they have learnt, such as going to university, becoming a chef, pro-tennis player, pro-gymnast, gymnastics coach, and a writer! It was fantastic to hear the aspirations of our young carers, as often a caring role stops them from achieving their hopes and dreams. We hope to encourage these aspirations by hosting 'career' activities, so we can work with young carers to achieve their goals.

Thank you to those of you who also attended the YCAD Professionals event. Through discussions, we heard that many schools are identifying hidden young carers throughout and due to the pandemic. We would like to work with you to continue to identify those young carers and ensure the appropriate support is there. Have you identified young carers you were previously unaware of?

To ensure schools are equipped to support new/existing young carers, we will be planning further virtual networking opportunities to share ideas and best practice. If this is something you would be interested in, please do let me know if you have any particular availability that suits you best.
