Contact Information - It is your responsibility as a parent to ensure the school office are notified of any change in contact details, such as address, telephone number or email address. Dinner money—This needs to be paid daily or weekly. If you have an outstanding balance, your child must bring in a packed lunch until this balance has been cleared.

Lateness—School starts at 8:30am and your child must be present on the school playground ready to be taken to class by their teacher.
