Safety Message

We have recently been made aware of a few incidents near to other schools whereby children have been approached by an adult not known to them.

Please make sure that you talk to your children about what to do if they are approached by strangers whilst they are out playing or on their way to and from school.

Remember STRANGER DANGER

Basic Stranger Danger rules include:

- never go anywhere with a stranger.
- never accept gifts or sweets from a stranger.
- never get in a car with a stranger.
- never go off on your own without telling your parents or a trusted adult where you are going.
- tell your child it is okay to break normal, everyday rules if they are in danger.
- encourage your child to SHOUT, KICK, SCREAM, LIE or RUN AWAY, if they feel they are in danger
- give your child a code word or sign that only you (Parents and carers) and your child know. They can use it when they feel they are in danger but don't want other people around them to know
- If out without an adult, tell your child to stay with their friends and not to go off on their own.

It is always a good idea to ensure that your child either knows your contact number off by heart, or has it written on a piece of paper in their pocket so that they or someone helping them can contact you.
