





Behaviour expectations...

- Calls home will be made if card is turned 3 times in a week.
- Reoccurring behaviour concerns will result in a parent meeting with the senior team.
- Detentions will be given for recurring behaviour concerns.
- Serious concerns will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
- Parents should keep open communication with their child's class teacher regarding any behaviour concerns.
- If your child is exhibiting serious concerns, they may be put on the Growth Mindset programme to help them to develop positive self image and learn to self regulate.

National exams...

Reception: Reception Baseline — first 2-3 weeks of starting school. Year I: Phonics screening — June Year 4: Times Table Multiplication Check – June Year 6: SATs — May

- Asleep by an appropriate time (7pm Reception class, no later than 9pm Year 6)
- No devices in the evening, especially unattended. Pupils should not have their phones/tablets whilst in bed.
- Home learning completed consistently every day calls will be made if pupils do not complete home learning.
