

English

In English, we have been looking at the story of *Journey to Jo'burg'*. We wrote a narrative, as well as a letter about the story. The pupils really enjoyed this text and have produced some excellent pieces of writing.

Mathematics

In mathematics, we began the year by revising our knowledge of number and place value. We then moved on to look at the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). We have been using all the skills we've learnt and applying them to solve problems and investigations.

Science



Our science topic this term has been 'Properties and changes of materials'. We compared and group together everyday materials of the basis of their properties, including their hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal), and response to magnets. We undertook experiments to find out which materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution. We discovered how we would separate materials through filtering, sieving and evaporating.
