English


In English, we have been looking at the story of `*Journey to Jo'burg'*. We wrote a narrative, as well as a diary entry about the story. The pupils really enjoyed this text and have produced some excellent pieces of writing.

Mathematics

In mathematics, we began the year by revising our knowledge of number and place value. We then moved on to look at the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). We have been using all the skills we've learnt and applying them to solve problems and investigations.

<u>Science</u>

Our science topic this term has been 'living things and their habitats'. We have looked at different species of animal and classified them into different categories based on their features and characteristics. We also looked at microorganisms. We took swabs from different locations around school and observed the development of bacteria on our sealed petri dishes.



DT

In DT, the children have been researching and tasting foods from Japan and Africa. They have particularly enjoyed designing and making their own sushi and overnight oats recipes!



Geography.

In Geography, we have been studying Japan and Africa. We looked at human and physical features within each country, as well as researching famous landmarks. We also looked at the impact that natural disasters have had in these regions. We finished this unit by working in small groups to produce a short documentary on our chosen country.
