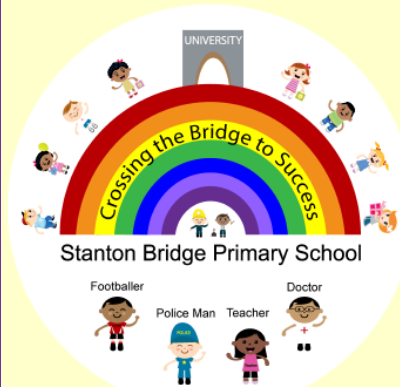

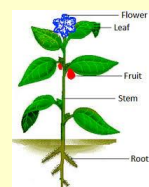
Mathematics
